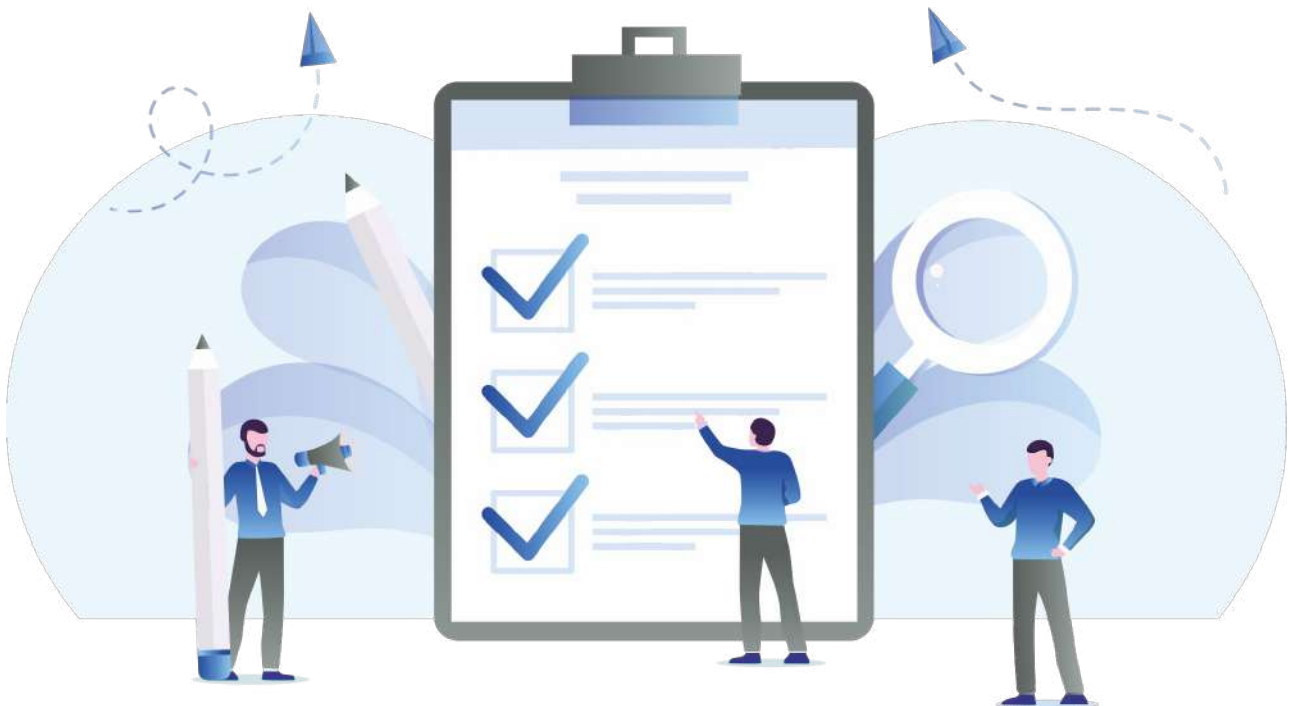

Applicant's Personal Details

> Passport

 Required  Original

Provide the pages of the child's current passport showing their photo, personal details, and passport issue and expiry dates.

> National Identity Document

 Recommend  Original

Provide a national identity card, if the child has one

> Birth Certificate or Adoption Letter (if applicable)

 Required  Original

For every dependant 18 years old or younger who are applying with you, provide: - Copies of birth certificates or the family book showing the names of both parents of all your dependent children - copies of the adoption paper, if applicable.

Evidence of Change of Name

> Marriage Certificate or Deed Poll Certificate (Proof of change of name)

 Recommend  Original

If anyone in the application has changed his or her name, certified copies of documents verifying the name change. This might include a marriage or deed poll certificate or a certified copy of evidence of the name change.

Character Documents

> Overseas Police Clearance Certificate

 Recommend  Original

1) An overseas police certificate from every country, including your home country, where you spent a total of 12 months or more in the last 10 years since you turned 16 2) Military service records or discharge papers if you served in the armed forces of any country

> Australian Federal Police Check

 Recommend  Original

Provide an Australian police certificate (AFP) if you have spent a total of 12 months or more in Australia in the last 10 years since you turned 16. Only complete disclosure National Police Certificates issued by the Australian Federal Police is accept. Standard disclosure certificates or national police certificates issued by Australian state or territory police will not be Acceptable. For immigration purposes, Australian police certificates are valid for 12 months from the date of issue.



Visa Application Forms

> **Personal particulars for assessment including character assessment [Form 80]**  Recommend  Original

Children over 16 years of age must complete and provide Form 80 Personal particulars for assessment including character assessment



> **Parental Consent Form [Form 1229]**  Recommend  Original

If you have a child under the age of 18 included in the visa application and one or both parents (or legal guardians) are not applying for an Australian visa, both parents will need to complete and sign the Form 1229 - Consent form to grant an Australian visa to a child under the age of 18 years. If you have sole custody of the child/ren, provide evidence such as a court order.

> **Application for a subclass 445 (temporary) visa by a dependent child [Form 918]**  Required  Original

Form 918 is an application for an Extended Eligibility (temporary) visa (Dependent Child (subclass 445)). This form may be used by a dependent child of a parent who has been granted: • a subclass 445 visa; OR • a temporary Partner visa in Australia; OR • a provisional Partner visa overseas.

Health Assessment

> **Applicants over 18 with disability**  Recommend  Certified

Provide evidence from a qualified medical practitioner that the applicant has a total or partial loss of mental or body function that stops them from working.



Business Documents

> **Financial statements**  Required  Original

If the child is over 18 when the application is made, provide evidence they are dependent on their parent who holds the temporary Partner or Dependent Child visa for basic needs such as food, shelter and clothing, and how long this support has been provided. Evidence could include: • bank statements • money transfers • rent receipts

Applicant's Personal Details

> **Passport**  Required  Original

Provide the pages of the child's current passport showing their photo, personal details, and passport issue and expiry dates.



 Required  Original

Australian Passport OR Permanent Residency Grant Letter

Provide evidence that you are a settled Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or eligible New Zealand citizen such as: • a birth certificate • an Australian passport • evidence you are an Australian permanent resident • an Australian citizenship certificate • if you are a New Zealand citizen, evidence to show how long you have lived in Australia and your continued links to Australia

🕒 Evidence of Change of Name



 Recommend  Original

Marriage Certificate or Deed Poll Certificate (Proof of change of name)

If anyone in the application has changed his or her name, certified copies of documents verifying the name change. This might include a marriage or deed poll certificate or a certified copy of evidence of the name change.

🕒 Relationship Document



 Recommend  Original

Marriage Certificate or Divorce Certificate or Separation Document or Statutory Declaration or Death Certificate

Evidence of your relationship with your spouse/de facto partner include a copy of your marriage certificate, Death certificate, Divorce Certificate, Separation Document or Statutory Declaration or other evidence of family composition.

🕒 Character Documents

> Australian Federal Police Check

 Required  Original

Provide an Australian police certificate (AFP) if you have spent a total of 12 months or more in Australia in the last 10 years since you turned 16. Only complete disclosure National Police Certificates issued by the Australian Federal Police is accept. Standard disclosure certificates or national police certificates issued by Australian state or territory police will not be Acceptable. For immigration purposes, Australian police certificates are valid for 12 months from the date of issue.
