Applicant's Personal Details

Passport

Required Original

Provide the pages of your current passport showing your photo, personal details, and passport issue and expiry dates.

> Passport sized photographs

Required Original

You must provide photographs of yourself if you apply on paper. The photos must be: • passport-sized • less than 6 months old • good quality colour. We don't accept laser copies • a full-face view of your head and shoulders • taken against a plain light-coloured background You can wear untinted prescription glasses. If you wear a head covering for religious reasons, you can show only your face.

> National Identity Document

Certified copy of National Identity Card (both sides) if you have one

> Birth Certificate or Adoption Letter (if applicable)

Required Original

Provide a copy of your birth certificate showing both your parents' names. If you don't have a birth certificate and you can't get one, provide a copy of the identification pages of one of these: • a family book showing both your parents' names • government-issued identification • a court-issued document that verifies your identity

> Change of Name documents

Recommend Original

If you have changed your name, provide proof such as: • a marriage or divorce certificate • change of name documents from an Australian Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages, or the relevant overseas authority • documents that show other names you have been known by

English Language Ability Test



> English Proficiency





Pathway 1: Provide evidence that: • you are a citizen of and hold a valid passport issued by the United Kingdom, the United States of America, Canada, New Zealand or the Republic of Ireland, OR • an Australian Adult Migrant English Program service provider has assessed your English as functional Pathway 2: Provide evidence that you have completed: • English Bagrut exam in the level of 3 study units and you are a citizen of and hold a passport from Israel. • all years of primary school and at least 3 years of secondary school where all instruction was in English • at least 5 years of secondary school (in or outside Australia) where all instruction was in English • at least 1 year of full-time study towards an award at an institution in Australia where all instruction was in English • the part-time equivalent of 1 year of full-time study towards an award at an institution in Australia where all instruction was in English, or • 2 years of a full-time studying or training for a degree, higher degree, diploma or trade certificate (in or outside Australia) where all instruction was in English Pathway 3: Provide evidence that, in the 12 months before you applied for the visa, you scored: • an average band score of at least 4.5 based on 4 parts of an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test • a total band score of at least 32 based on the 4 test components of speaking, reading, writing and listening of a Test of English as a Foreign Language internet-based test (TOEFL iBT) • an overall band score of at least 30 based on 4 parts of a Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic, or • an overall band score of at least 147 based on 4 parts of a Cambridge C1 Advanced test

Occuments

> Overseas Police Clearance Certificate





You may be required to provide a police certificate (also called a penal clearance certificate) from every country you lived in. It will usually be if you are over 17 and lived in any of the listed countries, including Australia, for at least 12 months in the past 10 years. Police certificates are valid for 12 months from the issue date. They must cover: • the time you turned 16 up to the issue date OR • the whole time you were in the country

> Australian Federal Police Check





Provide a copy of your Australian Federal Police check. This is generally required when you have spent a total of 12 months in Australia after turning 16 years of age.

> Military Certificate





You may need to provide a military certificate with your visa application. If required, it will usually be when you served for more than 12 months in any country's military force. A military certificate can be a letter from your commanding officer. It should say you have not been convicted of any criminal offence while in the military. You may also need to provide a police certificate for every country you served in for over 12 months. This includes where you were stationed at a military base.

Other Documents

Government support





You must obtain a letter of support from your government (or alternative as stated below) before lodging your visa application. You do not need to provide a letter of support from your government if you are from: • Austria • Argentina • Chile • Israel • China, People's Republic of • Portugal • Singapore • Spain • the United States of America



> Curriculum Vitae or Resume






Your curriculum vitae or résumé should include full employment and educational history, including dates and positions held.

Education related documents

> Academic Qualification Certificate(s)



Submit scanned copy of (all) your original qualification certificate(s), i.e. Diploma, Bachelors, Masters or PhD Award certificate.

Financial Documents

Financial Documents





Provide evidence you have enough money for your stay in Australia. This is usually AUD5,000. This can include bank statements, credit card limits, personal savings, etc. You must also show that you have enough money to buy a ticket to leave Australia at the end of your stay, or that you already have the ticket.
